Examples of time words:
Yesterday, today, tomorrow,
last year, at lunch time,
later, after, two o'clock, at
Christmas, in the summer,
during the evening, when the
snow falls.

Where



Where is a place

Examples of where words:
park, zoo, school, shops,
bed, my Nan's house, our
classroom, the canteen, the
toilets, holiday house, back
yard, playground, beach,
under the bed, church, on
an island.

Who



**Who is a
Person or an
animal**

Examples of who words:

Mum, Dad, my sister, Jenny,
the man next door, my
teacher, the brown cat, the
thief, a baby, the principal,
Nanna, a hero, me, you, we,
our class, my pet turtle.

What

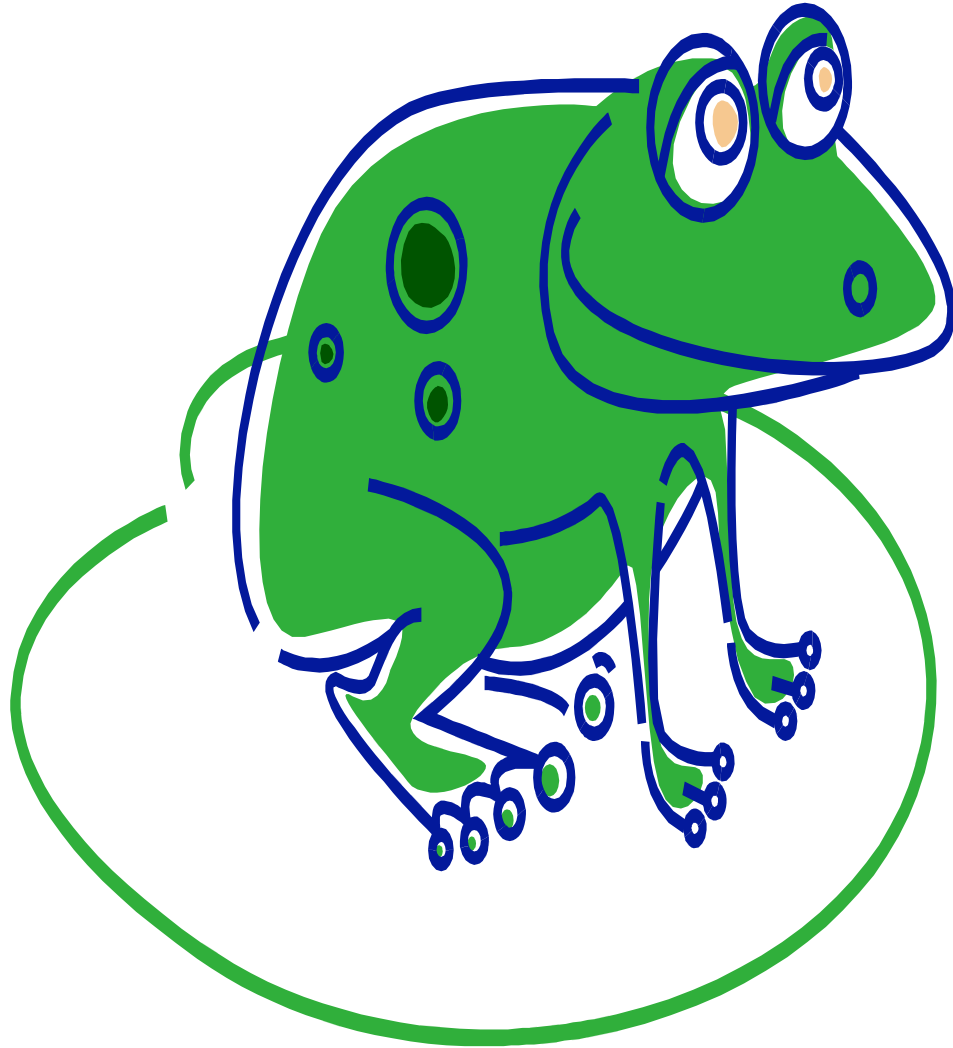


What words are usually verbs (action words)

Examples of what words:

Ran, jumped, left, ate, took, fed, played, slept, took, wrote, drank, brushed, shopped, finished, cleaned, yelled, cried, sat, bought, moved, went dancing.

Which

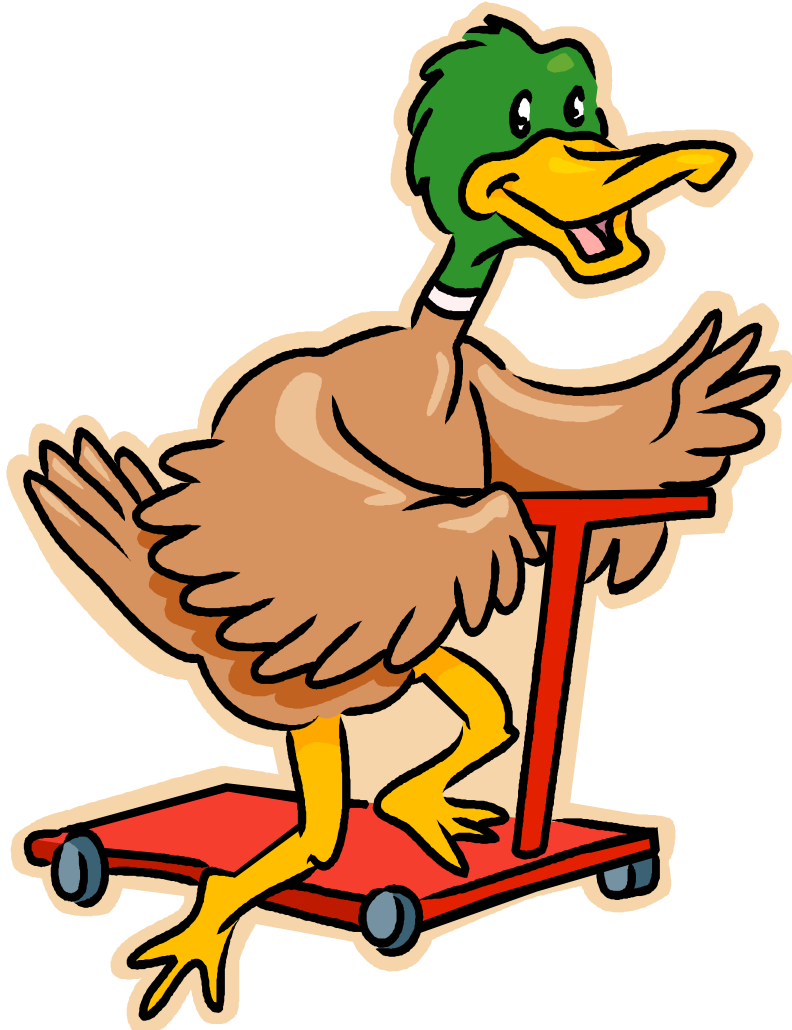


Which words are usually adjectives (describing words)

Examples of which words:

Red, green, long, flat, sunny, cold, girl, boy, hairy, tall, short, long, old, noisy, tiny, young, lonely, sad, huge, tasty, wet, smelly, pretty, new, shiny.

How



**How words can
be adverbs
(adverbs
describe verbs)**

Examples include:

Quickly, slowly, immediately,
strangely, quietly, smoothly,
madly, sadly, swiftly, cleverly,
softly, loudly, lovingly.

How



**How words can
be verbs
(action words)**

Examples include:

Drove, ran, swam, raced,
moved, rode, walked, flew,
skied, skated, crawled,
climbed, hiked, rushed,
carried, chased, strolled.

Why



Why questions ask the reason for something. They ask you to explain what caused something to happen.

The answer will start with *It happened because....*

One example is

Sarah was hurt because she fell over.
